

Damn Yankees was the second and final musical written by the team of Richard Adler and Jerry Ross. Bob Fosse did the original choreography. The dance number "Who's Got the Pain" was credited with escalating Fosse's wife, Gwen Verdon, to stardom in 1955. As Angie, Mike and I prepared to begin work on this show, we could not figure out what in the world that number had to do with baseball. In the true tradition of early musicals, the answer to that question: not one thing. A dance number was needed in act 2, so a dance number is there! In 1955, the number had star power!

Damn Yankees is called "a sassy blend of baseball and the Faust legend". It is an adaptation of a book called "The Year the Yankees Lost the Pennant", by Douglas Wallop. An aging baseball fan (Joe Boyd) sells his soul to the devil for the opportunity to be a baseball star. He becomes "Shoeless Joe Hardy" and he leads the Washington Senators to defeat the Yankees in the World Series.

Colleagues who have directed Damn Yankees always say it is one of their favorites. The show starts with three large production numbers in a row (Six Months Out of Every Year, Shoeless Joe, and Heart). This presents a huge challenge in regard to the energy level of the cast and the directors. I understand now why people who work with teenagers like the show. It allows the boys to burn off a ton of energy in the first 20 minutes of the production!

A wonderful revival of Damn Yankees was produced in New York in 1994. The script was revised. We have attempted to use some of the revisions. If you were familiar with the original script, you may notice this. Hopefully the changes are refreshing. We hope you find our presentation of Damn Yankees entertaining. We hope that you find it uplifting. It is interesting that in the fable, the devil wins souls by giving people exactly what they want! Sometimes the dream isn't what you expect it to be, and losing the dream is actually the victory.

**NOTES FROM THE SPA ADMINISTRATIVE DIRECTOR**

Thank you for supporting the SPA program with your attendance tonight. The students had a terrific time this summer as we went "back to the 50s"; back to the good old days. Tonight when you look up on stage at the performance, what will you see? Will you see the talent of performers? Will you see the results of the hard work during rehearsals? The answer to those questions is probably "yes". And this **is** a very talented, hard-working group of students.

But can you see beyond the performance? Can you see beyond the rehearsals?
